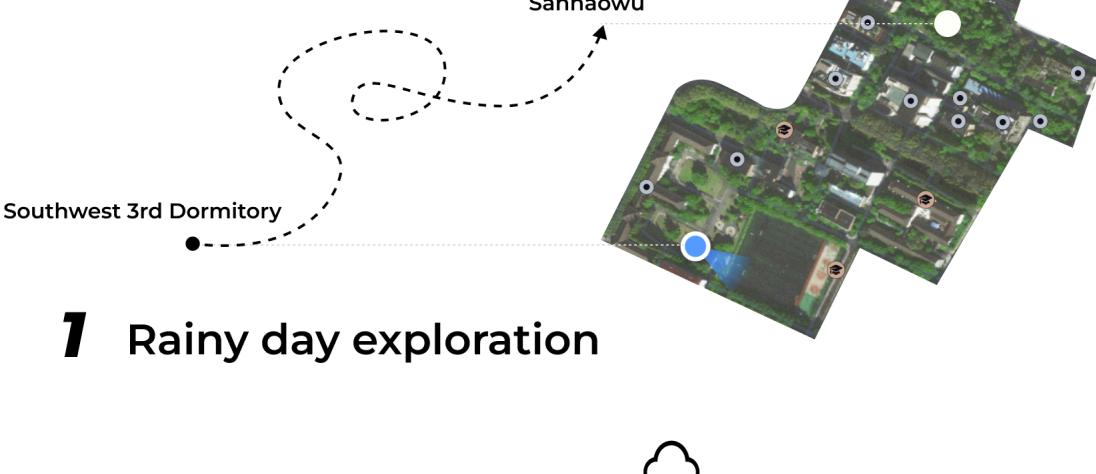
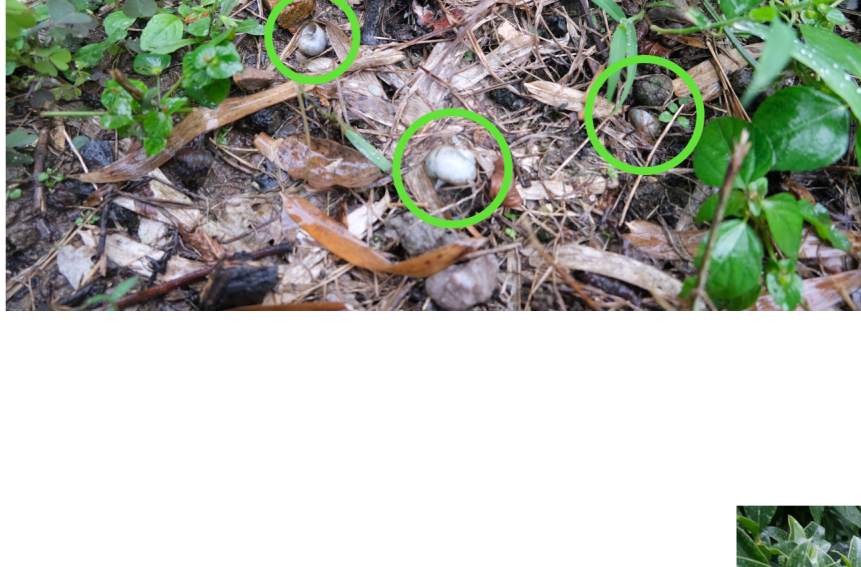

1 Rainy day exploration

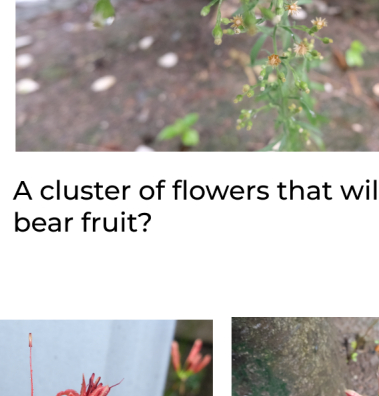


It's the perfect rainy day for them to go out, but they're all dead

Small fruits, common forms

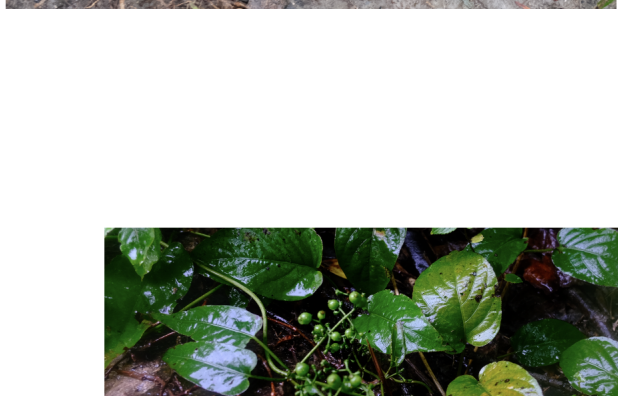


A cluster of flowers that will later bear fruit?

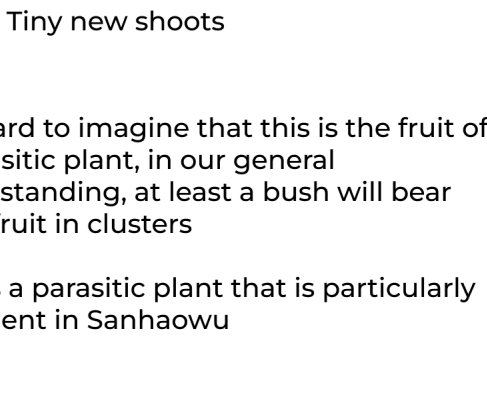


I would like to know how such flowers are reproduced

Dividing offspring directly from the root system

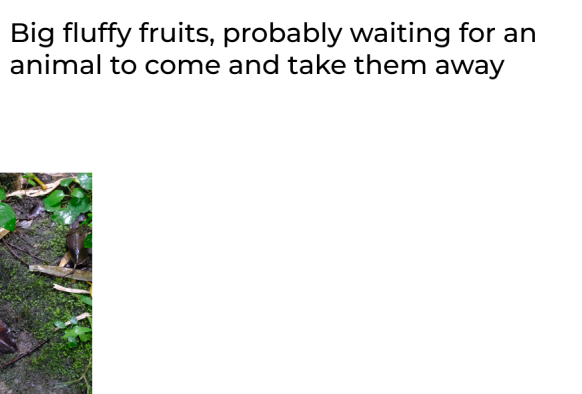


Tiny new shoots

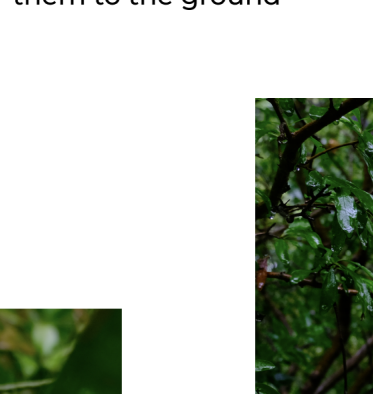


It is hard to imagine that this is the fruit of a parasitic plant, in our general understanding, at least a bush will bear such fruit in clusters

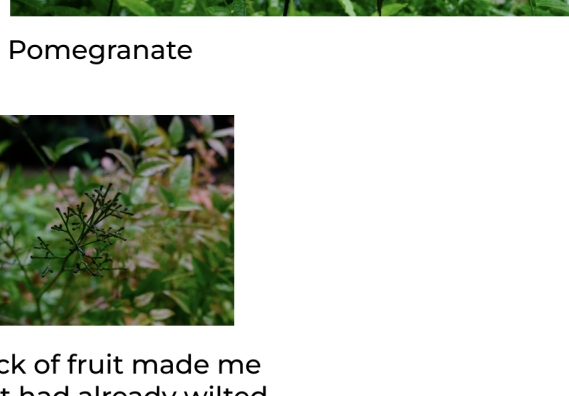
This is a parasitic plant that is particularly prevalent in Sanhaowu

Maybe they were waiting for the rain to bring them to the ground



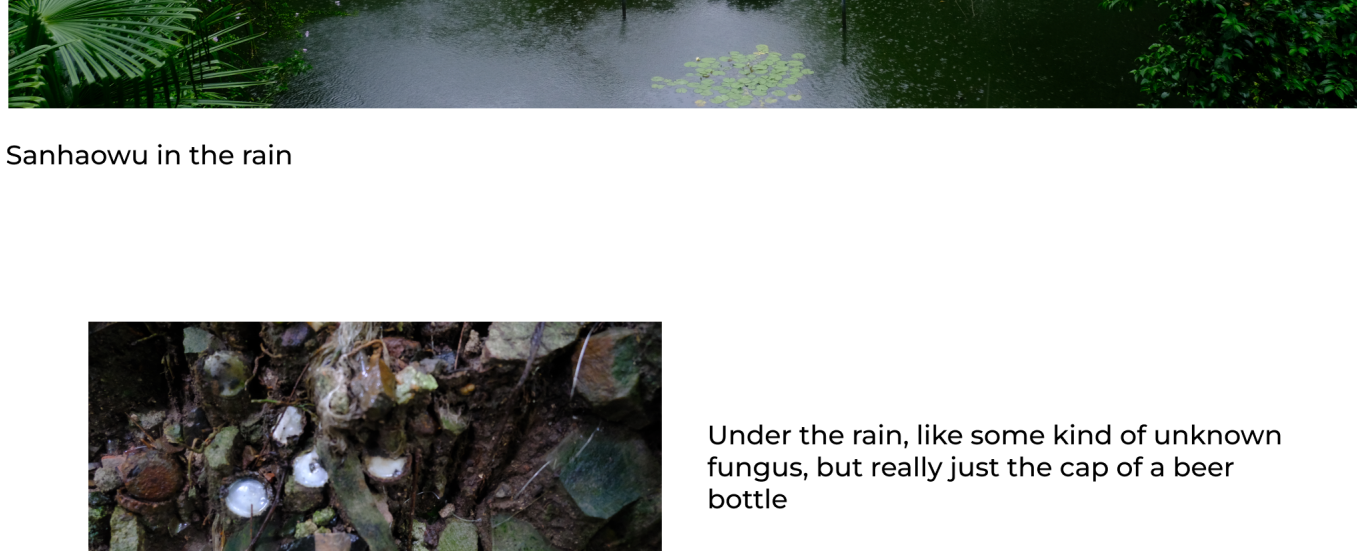
Pomegranate



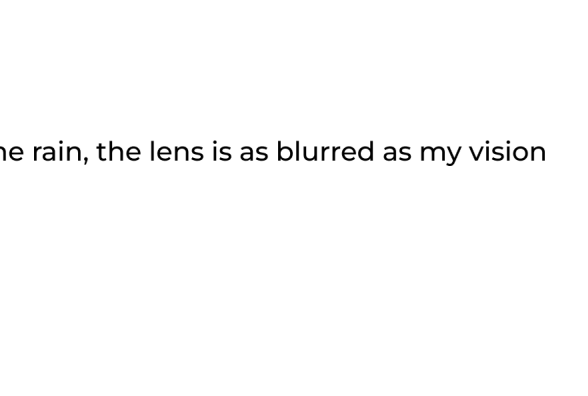
It is amazing that such a small branch can produce such a large fruit



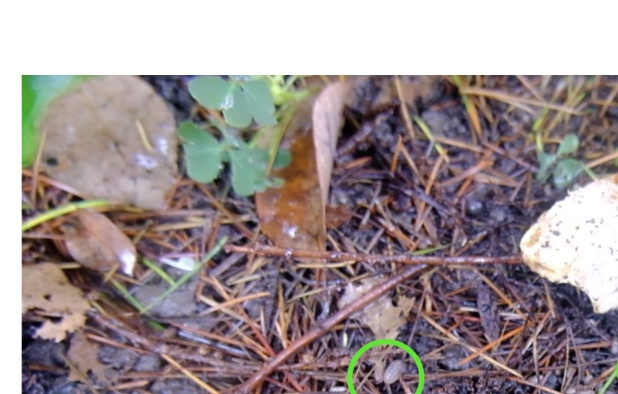
The lack of fruit made me think it had already wilted



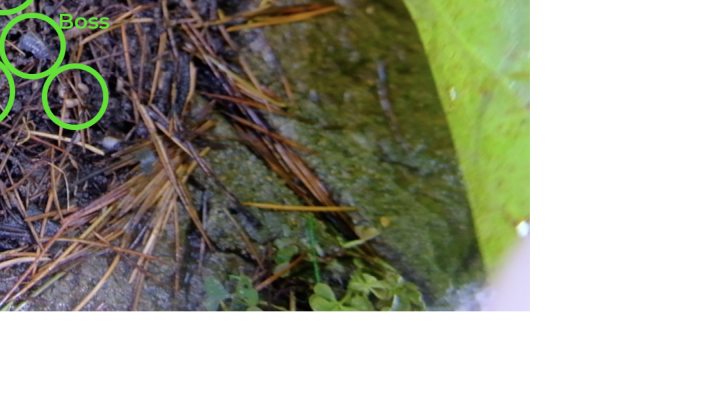
Sanhaowu in the rain

In the rain, the lens is as blurred as my vision

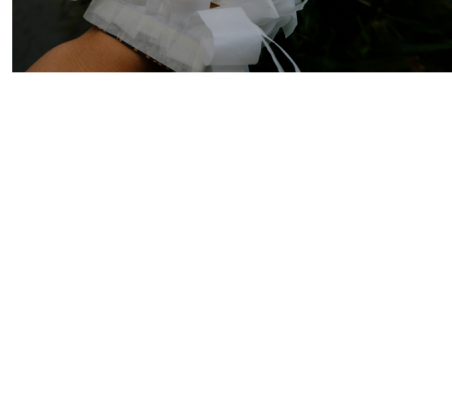


The battle between bugs and bugs under the leaves

Through the grass, all the grass fed back to me with a gentle bounce, instead of the previous scraping and pricking



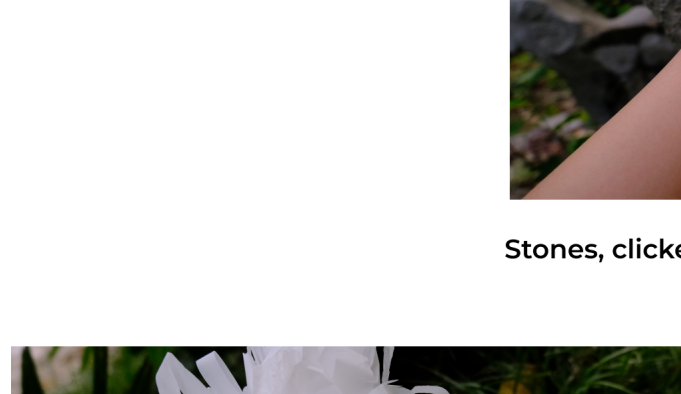
Hello! branch Because of the implication of the fur, it dances with me



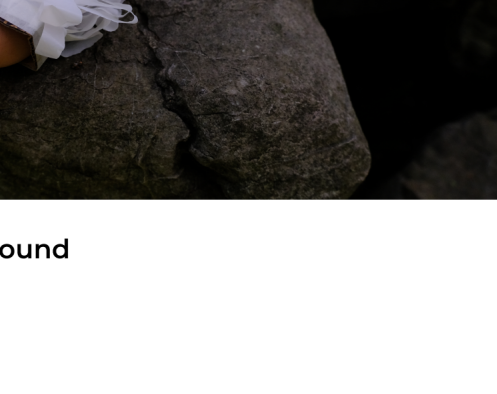
A small cluster of grass, bouncing



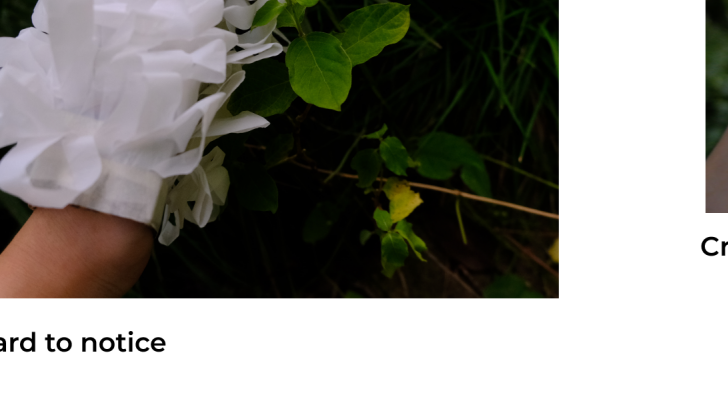
Stones, clickety-clack sound



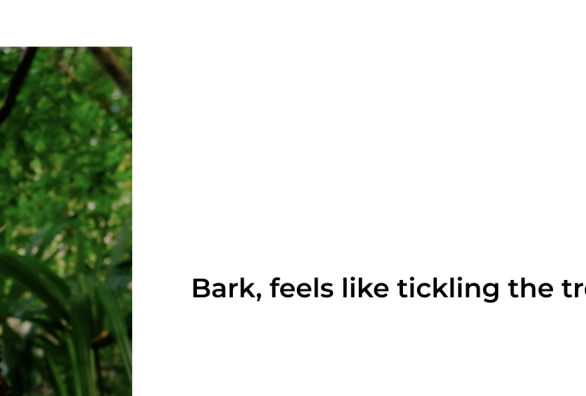
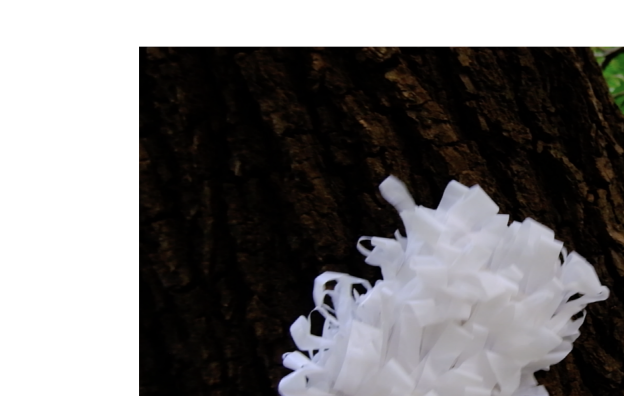
Spike, hard to notice



Crusting of branches



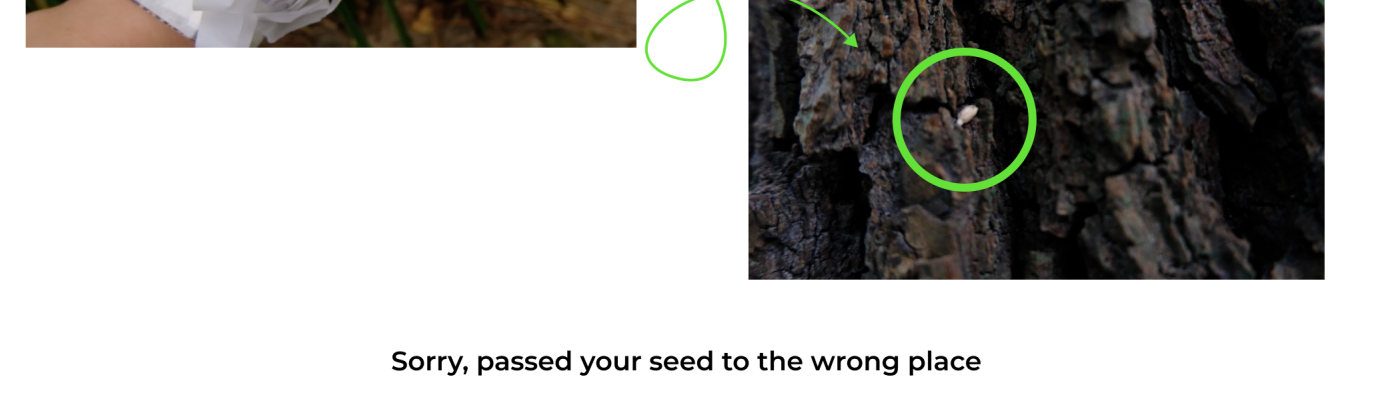
Bark, feels like tickling the tree
